BOUNDARY MONASH LOOP — 212 km / 132 mi!



Majestic mountains, deep valleys and scenic hot springs, the Monash Loop is an outdoor lover's dream. Fishing, hiking, rock climbing in the summer and Cat or Hell-skiing in the winter, there's no shortage of outdoor experiences to be had.

SIMILKAMEN VALLEY ROAD TRIP — 164 km / 102 mi!



Full of natural wonders, the Similkamen Valley is a mix of eclectic small towns, outstanding wineries and has the claim to fame as the "Organic Capital of Canada". Epic adventures are waiting for you in Cathedral and Manning Provincial Parks and the history and heritage of the area is waiting to be discovered.

BIG WHITE BOUNDARY ROAD TRIP — 232 km / 144 mi!



The star of this road trip is Big White Resort, an all-season getaway in the mountains covered in Okanagan champagne powder in the winter and full of mountain biking adventure in the summer. With many access points to the Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail, this route is all about being outside.

NORTH THOMPSON VALLEY/COLUMBIA ICEFIELDS PARKWAY LOOP — 443 km / 275 mi

The North Thompson Valley stretches from Kamloops, British Columbia to Mount Robson Provincial Park. This road trip offers access to broad sweeping valleys, dozens of fishing lakes, ranches, breathtaking waterfalls, ancient glaciers and mountains that touch the clouds. This Loop is more than a drive through the mountains. It takes you through iconic Canadian national parks giving travellers the opportunity to experience true Canadiana, as well as amazing wildlife viewing possibilities.



GOLD COUNTRY LOOP — 198 km / 123 mi

Gold Country's diverse landscapes range from semi-arid desert to thick forests dotted with lakes, meadows and river canyons. Don't miss the dramatic landscapes of the Nicola Valley or glacial shorelines of ancient lakes. Around the city of Kamloops visit exceptional wineries with vines growing throughout the Thompson Valley. And get ready to cast your line, plenty of freshwater lakes and rivers provide ample opportunity to reel in the big one.



SHUSWAP LOOP — 267 km / 166 mi

Music and the sweet sounds of waves lapping on the shoreline are themes along the Shuswap Loop. This land of lakes is home to 22 provincial parks, Sicamous - the houseboating capital of Canada, and the very popular Salmon Arm Roots & Blues Festival. An added bonus, this loop has plenty of fully accessible accommodations and activities so you can be sure everyone can be involved.



OKANAGAN CORRIDOR — 209 km / 130 mi

With over 150 licensed wineries, one of the most beautiful lakes in the world, true land to table culinary experiences and breathtaking views, the Okanagan Corridor is worth taking the time to explore. Camp at one of over 100 campgrounds, spend time visiting orchards and vineyards, paddling or swimming the many lakes or hiking or biking the trails.

CASCADE LOOP — 360 mi / 579 km



National Geographic calls the Cascade Loop "One of America's grandest, most spectacular drives." Epic mountain views, ocean breezes, and beautiful national forests are waiting for you on this road trip.

HISTORIC HIGHLANDS LOOP — 121 mi / 195 km



Get a taste of rural life as you explore the small towns along this route. Cowboy culture, wineries, and stunning views await road trippers travelling through this area.

THREE COUNTY CORRIDOR — 139 mi / 224 km



Crossing through Okanagan, Douglas and Chelan counties in north central Washington, the Three County Corridor provides access against awe-inspiring views.

COLVILLE TRIBES ROAD TRIP — 330 mi / 531 km



History, art, and geographic wonders can be found along the Colville Tribes route. Take your time and travel along the Columbia and San Poil Rivers, as well as the Sherman Pass Scenic Byway.

ICE AGE FLOODS LOOP — 142 mi / 238 km



Travel back in time along the Ice Age Floods Loop and take in the dramatic landscapes created thousands of years ago by cataclysmic floods that swept through the northwestern states.

MANY LAKES ROAD TRIP — 72 mi / 116 km



Perfect for history buffs and outdoor enthusiasts, this route features historical sites, wildlife areas and plenty of campgrounds. Get a true rural experience and explore the back roads of this area.
